Trip Reports

Trip report

Saturday 19th August, Daly's Clearing Loop, Leader: Becky

Participants: Anne and Owen Porter, Welcome to Joseph McGowan first tramp with the club.



With heavy rain watches for Sunday this trip was hastily rescheduled to Saturday to get in before the rain. A small group so we were able to hop in one car for the trip to Franklin Road | end. With boots laced we hit the trail

at 9.30am. Conditions were partly cloudy, we did see some shadows on the ground throughout the morning. We took Dean's track off to the right, tackling the loop anti-clockwise. This climbs up through paddock with immediate views



of the Waitawheta river and surrounds. We soon entered the bush and the track gently undulated its way through to meet the track between Dicky's Flat and Daly's Clearing hut. We stopped at a favourable log for morning tea along

the way. Once joining the track it was less than an hour to the hut where we had an early lunch and met a gentleman celebrating his 70th birthday. After the hut the track climbed down to the Waitawheta river and the tramway track. We met a couple of groups climbing up to spend the night at the hut. Once at the river we followed it back to the car, reaching it at about 1.30pm, early enough to grab a treat at Ngatea on the way home.

Trip report 6th August 2023 Mt Karangahake summit loop Leader Becky, accompanied by John Kelsey and Mary Crawford



A very select group of 3 left Pukekohe at the usual time, full of excitement at the prospect of a day in the sun. Scotsmans Gully track is closed due to storm damage, so we travelled up Crown Hill Road to the parking area. We then followed the road on foot passing Scotsmans Gully track and soon came to the summit track branching off on the right. The

track is wide and was once used by vehicles, we met one gentleman on a quad who was doing some Possum hunting. It climbs steadily

skirting around the mountain, there was some discussion about taking the more direct track when we reached the junction, but it was felt this would be a slippery scramble after recent rains and we continued



as we were. There were some puddles and muddy patches but nothing major. Eventually we passed the junction with the Country Road Track and popped out of the bushline to see the summit in front of us. There was a steep rocky scramble down and then up to reach it in time for an early lunch enjoying views out to Waihi and the coast, the kaimai ranges and across the Hauraki flats out to the Firth of Thames. It was sadly too hazy to see the mountains.

We backtracked before taking the Country Road Track which continues the sidle around and gently down the mountain. When you reach a junction, follow the orange markers to your left, the track had to be redirected to bypass slip damage. It passes through lovely bush and further down there are mine shafts and lovely views of the gorge below to enjoy. Eventually we popped out onto the gravel road we started on, turn left and you will almost immediately see the start of the summit track you took up the mountain. Follow the road back to the start, which we reached at about 1.30pm. The whole tramp took about 4 hours including lunch break leaving time to stop in Paeroa for refreshments.

Small first aid pack / whistle

If in doubt ask the Trip Leader for advice for day, weekend or longer trips. It is recommended for all trips that the NZ Mountain Safety Council's pack liners be used. These are available from Charlie & Joy Browne (Phone 238 7298) at a cost of \$4.50 each. Use of Whistle:

Please remember the whistle should be your equipment of choice to attract attention if needed. If anybody falls behind and loses sight of others, feels unwell and must stop for a rest, becomes injured, etc then the agreed call to alert the Trip Leader and others in the party is **THREE (3) LONG whistle blasts**, **REPEATED as necessary.** The Trip Leader and/or others in the party will respond with **TWO (2) LONG blasts** indicating they have heard and are coming to your aid. It may be helpful in some circumstances that a repeat whistle blast will allow accurate location.

Club Gear:

All Club gear is stored at Charlie & Joy Browne's residence, Jenkin Road, Pukekohe West. All Club members are welcome to use the gear for Club and private trips (however Club trips have booking priority) – hireage to nonmembers is not encouraged. Club gear is, at all times, to be returned in good, clean condition. All losses/damages must be reported to the Club's Gear Custodians.

Monday night is cut-off point. Any member who does not adhere to this will miss out. The reason for the cutoff point is to allow time for the Trip Leader to arrange, transport, food, bookings, etc.

Contact Trip Leader for start place and time for trip.
